WHAT DOES THE FUND INVEST IN?

The Fund's investment objective is to obtain exposure to the performance of the S&P 500 Index, or a successor or replacement index (the "Index") and through the use of option strategies seek to moderate the volatility of that performance.

The charts below give a snapshot of the Fund's investments on March 31, 2023. The Fund's investments will change.







HOW RISKY IS IT?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility."

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

RISK RATING

Ninepoint Partners LP has rated the volatility of this Fund as low to medium.

This rating is based on how much the returns of Ninepoint Risk Advantaged U.S. Equity Index Class, which was merged into the Fund on December 10, 2021, have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.


Like most mutual funds, this Fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

HOW HAS THE FUND PERFORMED?

This section tells you how Series D units of the Fund have performed in the past 3 calendar years. This is based on the performance of the corresponding series of Ninepoint Risk Advantaged U.S. Equity Index Class, which was merged into the Fund on December 10, 2021. Returns are after fund expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart would generally show how Series D units of the Fund performed in the past 3 calendar years. However, year-by-year returns for Series D units of the Fund have not been presented for 2021 or 2022 because Series D units were not outstanding for the full calendar years. The Fund dropped in value in 1 of the 3 past calendar years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table would generally show the best and worst returns for Series D units of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 3 calendar years. However, the best and worst 3-month returns are only being presented for 2020 since Series D units were not outstanding for the full calendar year in 2021 and 2022. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

As at March 31, 2023, a person who invested \$1,000 in Series D units of the Fund at its inception would now have \$1,018.73. This works out to an annual compound return of 1.73%.

WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?	A WORD ABOUT TAX
The Fund is suitable for those investors seeking long-term capital growth and a core Canadian equity fund that seeks to provide some downside protection through the use of option strategies and tactical changes to the amount of equity exposure. Investors should be comfortable with low to medium investment risk and a long-term investment horizon.	In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live, the type of earnings (i.e., income or capital gains), and whether or not you hold the Fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.
Don't buy this Fund if you need a steady source of income from your investments.	Keep in mind that if you hold your Fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series D units of the Fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence your dealer firm to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other series, funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales Charges

There are no sales charges or commissions payable to your discount broker for Series D units of the Fund.

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.	Management expense ratio (MER) This is the total of the Fund's management fee and operating expenses.	1.33%
As of December 31, 2022, the Fund's expenses were 1.35% of its value. This equals \$13.50 for every \$1,000 invested.	Trading expense ratio (TER) These are the Fund's trading costs.	0.02%

More about the trailing commission

There is no trailing commission payable to your discount broker by Ninepoint Partners LP in respect of Series D units of the Fund.

3. Other Fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the Fund.

FEE	WHAT YOU PAY
Switch Fee / Conversion Fee	A fee of 0-2.0% of the value of the units you wish to switch or convert may be charged by your discount broker, as negotiated with your discount broker.
Short-Term Trading Fee	Ninepoint Partners LP may impose a short-term trading fee payable by the unitholder to the Fund of up to 1.5% of the aggregate net asset value of the units redeemed if such units are redeemed or switched within 20 days of their date of purchase or switch. For purposes of this short-term trading fee, units will be considered to be redeemed on a first-in first-out basis. If Ninepoint Partners LP detects excessive trading of the unitholder's units in the Fund within 90 days of purchasing or switching them, it reserves the right to charge an additional 3.0% of the net asset value of the units.
Registered Tax Plan Fees	No fee is charged to open, close or administer a registered tax plan administered by Ninepoint Partners LP. However, for other registered tax plans holding other investments in addition to securities of a Ninepoint mutual fund, an annual trustee fee may apply payable to the administrator of the plan.

WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities legislation in your province or territory.
